
Welcome to Paul Glazbrook (Frontier Services).

In 1912, an inspiring minister named Rev John Flynn, was appointed the first superintendent of what is today Frontier Services. A teacher by training, Flynn developed a deep awareness of the struggles of people on the land and issues surrounding their lack of basic services.

John Flynn's vision was as big as Australia – he wanted to create a "mantle of safety" for isolated outback communities.

His persuasive call to action captured the imagination of the Presbyterian Assembly, resulting in the establishment of the Australian Inland Mission (AIM). In 1926 the Federal Methodist Inland Mission (FMIM) joined with the AIM in this important work across remote Australia, along with the Congregational Union in the NT.

This vision of outreach lives on through Frontier Services. For over 100 years our "padres" and staff have been the welcome visitor, friend, counsellor and advocate for the people of remote Australia.
