### For prayer & reflection...

How can we move from fragmentation to unity? A hard struggle is required. It is the struggle to allow God's Spirit to work in us and recreate us. But this struggle is not beyond our strength. It calls for some very specific well-planned steps. It calls for a few moments a day in the presence of God when we can listen to God's voice precisely in the midst of our many concerns. It also calls for the persistent endeavour to be with others in a new way by seeing them not as people to whom we can cling in fear, but as fellow human beings with whom we can create a new space for God.

The beginning of the spiritual life is often difficult not only because the powers which cause us to worry are so strong but also because the presence of God's Spirit seems barely noticeable. If, however, we are faithful to our disciplines, a new hunger is the first sign of God's presence. When we remain attentive to this divine presence, we will be led always deeper into the kingdom.

### Pinery Fire project update - from UC e-News

The Pinery Fire began on 25 November in 2015 and burnt out 85 000 hectares. The Plains Community Churches (Hamley Bridge Uniting Church, Owen Community Church and Windsor Uniting Church) created the "Greening the Landscape" home garden project as a way to support local communities affected by the fire. The project has been a great success as volunteers with the project offer a listening ear, compassionate conversation, and a \$100 garden voucher to those whose gardens have been damaged by fire. So far they have given away 180 garden vouchers and are half way across the fire zone."The home visits and the gift of a \$100 gardening voucher has been a real ministry of encouragement," says Rev Dr Phil Marshall.
