Peter's placement

Council received a letter from Peter seeking an extension to his placement until 29th July, 2018.

Council resolved by consensus to support the request for this extension, and to write to Presbytery seeking endorsement of our recommendation.

Further action in the matter of ministry provision after Peter leaves is deferred until the visit to August CC by Rev Beth Seaman, our pastoral and oversight support person in the Synod office.

Children's ministry

<u>B-Team</u>: this year's B-Team celebration will be on Sunday Dec 3rd – put that one in your diary!

<u>Children's space</u> in the church – you will have noticed that there have been a couple of changes over the last few months to provision for a children's space in the worship area.

The need for such a space has changed in recent times and also varies from week to week; at the same time, providing such a

space gives an important signal that we do welcome children and take account of their particular needs. We will continue to monitor the situation.

Property

Geoff Lister placed on record the large amount of time people are putting in to the various jobs. He also reported:

- Repairs to the fence on Yacca Road adjacent to the driveway, and the fence along the rear boundary of Wheatland House from the shed to the street boundary;
- Repairs to the driveway entrance from Yacca Road;
- An extra "Spring clean" of Church required from time to time:
- There are pews surplus to requirements currently in storage: Council will consider the best way to deal with those.

Roof of Wheatland House

As noted at the AGM, the roof of Wheatland House needs attention. Reports have been received, and considerable discussion took place about (a) the best way to proceed and (b) how best to source the funding. The majority decision was to replace the roof completely. A Local Government grant has been made available and will contribute towards the cost. The work will proceed as soon as possible.

Africa appeal

We have received a request for assistance with a special appeal for the people living with drought, war and starvation in eastern Africa. Council is well aware of the several calls on the generosity of our people at the moment, but even so resolved to proceed with support for this appeal. It will be introduced on the first Sunday in May and will run for that month. We ask you all to consider how you might be able to contribute to this appeal.
