"A note from Peter"

No doubt you have heard reports of parts of east Africa experiencing their worst famine in years. A million people are already seriously at risk of dying. A number of organisations are responding with urgent help, one of them being Act for Peace (the National Council of Churches organisation that runs the annual Christmas Bowl appeal). As you will have read in Max's report last Sunday, the Church Council has agreed that during May we will support a special appeal that Act for Peace is making for emergency relief for the victims of this famine, and envelopes for that purpose will be available from next Sunday. I confess that when I received the material from Act for Peace (on the day of the Church Council meeting) I inwardly groaned.

We receive many requests for financial help .. most of them for worthy causes .. but there's only so much we can give or do. That's the reason we decided a few years ago to focus our support on just 3 main things each year and to support them well: the Lent Event, the Christmas Bowl appeal, and a project of the congregation's choosing.

Acting according to that policy, we have declined some requests for financial support or simply mentioned others for people to respond to if they wish (such as the recent floods in QLD and NSW). My first inclination was to do the same with this appeal. But as I was thinking about that, I remembered my grief and outrage, shared by many other people, at the recent use of chemical weapons that caused so much indiscriminate death, pain and suffering to people in Syria. With that memory came the thought that the number of victims of this famine will be hundreds of times greater .. mostly among the most vulnerable people of whom women and children are the majority .. unless people like us make a difference. In the story of the rich man and Lazarus (Lk 16: 19-31) Jesus reminds us that evil flourishes not just through the deliberate actions of evil people,

(such as those who use chemical weapons) but also through the inactions of otherwise good people who could make a positive difference but don't. That thought came to me as one of those that I've learned to recognise are often the prompting of the Holy Spirit, and so I brought the request to the Church Council to consider, and the Council agreed to support the appeal.

As I said before, there's only so much that any of us can do and sometimes we have to choose between competing needs. This appeal may be one to which you feel you cannot respond.

However, I encourage you at least to consider it.

Property and Finance

Report to Congregation from meeting held 25th April 2017 Last Tuesday we had a very productive meeting and the following is summary for members of the congregation.

Appointments

I was confirmed as Chairperson of the committee and extremely happy that Maureen Howland was appointed Deputy Chairperson. I look forward to her support during this year. David Greig was officially coopted to the committee, a decision that will need to be formalised as an elected member on some future occasion.

Roof of Wheatland House

Following the decision by Church Council that the roof, gutters and downpipes be replaced a contract has been entered into with Hindmarsh Roofing. A grant of \$1850 from the Holdfast Bay Council has been a significant help. The contractor has agreed to remove the gutters a couple of weeks before commencing the work so we can repaint, and repair any damage to, the fascias. Dene Goldsack has agreed to coordinate the painting and will be looking for assistance.

Repairs to paving

You should be aware that the bitumen paving around Wheatland House and the rear car park is in a very poor state of repair. We have had quotes for having some repair work done but the committee decided that the expense could not be justified at this time. David Greig has agreed to coordinate some temporary patching and unblocking a storm water drain at the corner of Wheatland House.

Removal of unwanted things

I will remove the unwanted air conditioner, an old filing cabinet, some old card tables with unsafe legs and some timber boxes. If you have use for any of the above items please speak to me. Church Council will consider what to do about the excess pews that we currently have.

Fencing repairs

Plans are in hand to replace the collapsed fence adjacent to the neighbour's garage in the rear Car park and the fence on Yacca Road. John Bollinger, David Grieg and Bob Heywood will coordinate this.

Rails by Church Door

Dene is working to obtain a quote so that unsafe situation can be corrected.

Sundry Matters

Ray will fix the light outside Wheatland House front door, John will organise a notice board for the use of hirers and Maureen and Von will consider the need for a regular spring clean of the Worship Centre to supplement the work of the cleaner.

Finance

Dennis gave his usual humorous summary of the current income and expenditure and pointed out the need for Property and Finance to consider ways of raising money as well as spending it. I am sure there will be more on this topic later.

As I said a very productive one and half hours.
