For prayer and action ...

Hundreds and hundreds [of ants] seasonally invaded the cells in which we were kept. Like the giant Gulliver in a rage of frustration and cold sweat I would stamp and slap and crush them without mercy, without any thought of their separate existence. But after days of this I got tired of my anger. It exhausted me. I watched how they worked together. And how, if I had crushed one in the night by accident, the others would gather around and if there was life in it still, comrades would lift this wounded companion and crawl up the vertical wall and search out an escape point through which they could take this maimed insect to be amongst its own. This incident became a symbol for me in this blank room with its three chained creatures [prisoners]. We cannot abandon the injured or the maimed, thinking to ensure our own safety and sanity. We must reclaim them, as they are part of ourselves. Brian Keenan, who was a prisoner of a small group of terrorists in Beirut from mid–1980's, for four and a half years.

A Thin Place - Day Retreat

Pastoral Placement at Seacliff

As most Seacliff people will be aware, Peter finishes with us at the end of July, 2018. Rev Beth Seaman, our contact person with the Presbytery, visited Church Council last meeting, to help us start taking the first steps towards transition to life after that time.

There are basically three options:

- Go straight to a new Placement without a break
- Have a 6-months or so Supply Placement
- Undertake a period of Intentional Interim Ministry.

Council recognises that the first one is simply not an appropriate way to go. We know there will be significant grieving to be done come that time, and we need to allow time for that to be processed before a new Placement begins.

The second one is not recommended by Presbytery. A more structured period to help us with intentional planning is preferred.

That brings us to the Intentional Interim Ministry. There are two possible reasons why a congregation might undertake this. The one that applies to us is the situation where there is a minister in placement who has been there for a long time and is dearly loved – and so the people will need a transition time. An Intentional Interim in this context represents a strong affirmation from the congregation of the minister.

This is Church Council's recommendation for us.

Two things need to be understood:

- The leaders of the Intentional Interim programme will challenge us to do some serious thinking about our future. We will need to do that anyway; perhaps we would avoid it as "all too hard" without some independent encouragement; in any case it's arguably better that we do it with some assistance.
- 2. It's Council's recommendation, but in the end <u>the</u> Congregation decides.

In the meantime -

We need to undertake a *Consultation* concerning the *Life and Witness of the Congregation*.

Again, we need to do this anyway – it's 5 years since the last one, and it's also an important first step in the Placements process. Please note the following information and plan to be involved if at all possible:

- We request just half an hour of your time ...
- ... during the period <u>Fri 13th</u> (evening) to <u>Sun 15th</u> (afternoon) of <u>October</u> this year. We hope that almost everybody will be able to find 30 minutes within that period.
- The process is a personal conversation with the Consultants appointed by Presbytery.
- Everyone is invited and indeed urged to take the opportunity to be part of the occasion – we need the widest possible range of responses in order to make the best decisions for our future.
- All responses are completely confidential. No submission or comment is quoted: the report is written up entirely in summary form.

So – a Congregation Consultation in October this year, and a recommendation for a time of Intentional Interim Ministry from the start of August next year. (Perhaps a final decision will emerge from the Consultation.) Please take these opportunities to help shape the direction of our congregation's life and ministry.
