Same Sex Marriage

Following the postal survey results, the federal government will now consider changes to the Marriage Act. The survey was a civil matter and any resulting changes to the Marriage Act will relate to how marriages are recognised under federal law. Churches and religious celebrants will not be legally required to marry couples against their conscience or theological understanding of marriage. The Uniting Church's position on marriage remains unchanged. The Assembly of the Uniting Church (ie national council) has been considering the matter for some time and is continuing to do so. The next time the full Assembly meets is the middle of 2018 and no decision will be made by the Uniting Church before that. As part of working toward making decisions though and to allow for productive discussions at the national meeting, the Assembly Standing Committee has invited input and comment from Synods (states). To aid in this discernment, they have asked all Synods to discuss the following three areas at their state gatherings:

- 1. Share your hopes and concerns about our conversation on marriage.
- 2. In what mutually respectful ways could we move together as a Church that reflects the breadth of who we are as the Uniting Church in Australia?
- 3. What matters would you like the Assembly Standing Committee to consider as it prepares for a discussion on this matter at the 15th Assembly?

The Synod of SA meets on Thus, Fri and Sat next week. Peter Moss, Kay Homes and Max Howland will be part of that. Please keep the Synod in your prayers as we meet to deal with a range of business, including responding to the Assembly in regard to marriage.
