Notes from the Treasurer

I am pleased to report the following information:

- Our contributions to the Mission Project (I.e. first Sunday, Oodnadatta church) to the end of June totals \$323.50. Please ensure that you use the envelopes provided, or label one of your own, so that we know exactly what you intend.
- 2. Our contribution to the Hasdak *family* totals **\$839** which I have transferred to their bank account.
- Our contribution to their *work* comprises \$162 spent by Josie on educational materials and \$750 which we will hold for them until a special bank account is established and Tarcisius and I are satisfied about accountability and transparency. I will also liaise with Rosefield UC to see if we can coordinate our support.
- 4. The grand total for this family is consequently **\$1751** which will be of real support to them and their work after their return. Tarcisius also said to me that any visitors would be welcome to their home next year and that he will send instructions for transport!
- I will prepare a thorough budget analysis for the forthcoming P&F meeting on July 31 and then CC meeting on Aug 14.
