Paul Whetham (clinical psychologist, Wheatland House) spoke to us two weeks ago about his **Soul Food Cafe** *Pastoral Care* + *Wellbeing Package* that he is presenting in November. It is a skills-based training designed to equip people and congregations with practical pastoral care skills for assist leaders and to develop participants' own wellbeing and deepen relationships.
