#### Worship at Seacliff, Feb-Mar-April

You will see from rosters out today that arrangements are in place to fill preaching appointments for all the Sundays of February. Beyond then depends on progress with the Supply and Placements processes. We will need <a href="PowerPoint">PowerPoint</a> assistance for Feb 3<sup>rd</sup> in particular.

#### Placement process:

- 1 Arrangements for the provision of Supply Ministry are proceeding quite slowly: I've had a couple of conversations but don't know when something might be arranged.
- 2 A "permanent" placement as I mentioned last week, one of the essential components of the process is preparing our Congregation Profile: a large document in five sections. As part of this morning's worship I will be floating an idea for obtaining contributions from the largest possible number of people. I encourage everyone to contribute to this document so that it accurately and fully reflects who we are.
- 3 I've had a most helpful conversation with Rev Ian Dow, the Synod person with the task of supporting congregations in our region. He will be delighted to assist us with the Strategic Planning that we need along the way to helping us with the actual formal Placements process. Ian will be coming to a meeting of Church Council on Feb 19<sup>th</sup>, and hopes to drop in to see us on a Sunday morning when he can find one available!!

#### Lenten study

I have heard that there has been a request for, or at least interest in, a Lenten Study this year. There are several options for a study programme: MediaCom has several titles, or there could be a home-grown one. One excellent title is for the Gospel of Luke (the lectionary gospel for this year) first written three years ago when it was last Luke's "turn" in the lectionary. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on March 6<sup>th</sup>; but don't be taken in – if we wish to use an older title, orders need to be placed by Feb 3<sup>rd</sup> if we want the booklets by March. Please speak to Max if you would like to be part of a Lent Study, and to find out more details about the options.
