Lenten Study

The timing of the Lenten Study groups continues to be fluid. The vast majority (of the 13 people!!) prefer Monday or Tuesday, so those will probably be the two days. It should be possible to make the two groups roughly the same size.

The congregation survey at the end of January

Thank you to all the people who contributed to the survey of three aspects of our life here. These are the results:

Participation in our activities

A number of responses were received form people indicating willingness to help as Bible Readers during worship, or leading in prayer; and also in helping provide pastoral care for our people.

Development and maintenance issues for our property

The projects you decided we should follow through are, in order of popularity:

- The electrical fuse box in the worship space
- Air conditioning for the worship space
- Attending to the data projector and/or the screen in the worship space
- Air conditioning for the meeting room (small hall)
- Replacing the air conditioner for the front room of Wheatland House
- Ensuring the fridge in Wheatland House is working properly
- Painting the kitchen and corridor of Wheatland House
- New floor covering in the Wheatland House kitchen
- A community garden inside the fence line of Wheatland House.

These were just the items on the list: there are several others that we know we have to tackle, but the survey was limited to the "discretionary" items.

Also – there is memory of funds obtained / given for a dishwasher in the hall kitchen: we need to follow up the story there.

Use of property

This survey was very interesting (at least, I thought so!).

There were just a few responses to this one, but they showed roughly equal support for all the proposed activities:

- Making the church space available for meeting and gatherings of committees and agencies of the wider church (the air conditioning will make the offer more likely to be taken up)
- Educational and teaching activities sponsored by Uniting College, UAICC (Aboriginal Congress) and specialist centres of excellence
- Making spaces available for community groups such as SALA (South Australian Living Artists) for art displays, and Brighton Secondary School or the Elder Conservatorium wanting to student present musical performances (some unease was expressed about these activities taking place in the worship space)
- Presentation and end-of-year celebrations for local early learning centres
- Wellness activities for Seniors and also for young mums [these two got the most support].

All the results from these surveys will form part of the information we use to complete the Congregation Profile we need for the Placement process to get under way.

Thank you also to the people who have completed, or are completing, copies of the Profile document.

Matters from the wider church National Redress Scheme

As previously advised, the UCA has recently joined the National Redress Scheme for people who have suffered sexual abuse while in institutional care.

In SA it happens that we are looking at a relatively small number of cases, so the cost to the church is not expected to be very great. Even so, there is no provision anywhere in SA budget systems for any funding for the redress scheme, so the required funds are being raised by a levee on all congregations. The levee is 0.17% of total income [for us that amounts to a little under \$200 this year, depending on what are counted as sources of income] for the next 10 years.

While just one case requiring redress is one too many, we should also keep this in perspective: other churches have been bankrupted as a result of the evils perpetrated.

Presbyteries

Just for information at this stage: you may have heard that Presbyteries (Regional Councils) are being re-established in the Uniting Church in SA. While we don't need to make a formal decision yet – the structural stuff hasn't been sorted out yet – we will have a decision to make at some stage about which Presbytery to join.

Proposals from the latest Presbytery / Synod meeting

There were several proposals carried recommending actions for Congregations to take – more details about these in due course:

- Reducing our use of single-use plastic items
- The Five Leaf Eco Awards
- Break the Silence Sunday calling out and acting against domestic violence
- A number of seminars and teaching sessions.
