# **Church Council report**

Council met last Tuesday, and there was a long conversation about three important matters.

However, there are three special occasions on the remaining Sundays of April Sundays, so the first of these matters will be held over until May.

# The financial aspects of ministry provision at Seacliff.

Our current level of giving for 2019 is not sufficient to sustain the costs of a minister in full-time placement. In May, we will undertake a financial planning exercise that will give us, and Placements Committee, a better indication of our anticipated income over the next two years and whether we can support a full-time minister. This is an advance notice – more details available closer to the time.

# Presbytery restructure

You may recall that the organisational structure of the Uniting Church, in SA at any rate, is changing. We are advised that we need to call a brief Congregation meeting to make a formal decision about how we wish to proceed. Please note the date of May 19<sup>th</sup>: the meeting will be held immediately after worship and before morning tea. Information for this meeting will be provided in May.

## Use of our property for same-gender marriages

We know this is a matter of concern for some people, with a range of opinion found among our people. This note is just to advise that Council has established a process for resolving the matter – we will work through it in June, once the other pressing issues have been addressed.
