John 21: 15- 19.

¹⁵ When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" "Yes, Lord," he said, "you know that I love you. "Jesus said, "Feed my lambs." ¹⁶ Again Jesus said, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He answered, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Take care of my sheep." ¹⁷ The third time he said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, "Do you love me?" He said, "Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you." Jesus said, "Feed my sheep. ¹⁸ Very truly I tell you, when you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go."

¹⁹ Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, **"Follow me!"**

Seacliff's place in the wider Uniting Church This is the first of two inserts with information for our Congregation meeting on the 19th of May.

1 Why we need to decide

You may be aware that the SA Synod of the Uniting Church is reestablishing the regional Councils known as Presbyteries after about 10 years of having just one to cover all of SA.

Some historical context:

- The normal arrangement across the UCA is to have several Presbyteries make up a (state) Synod; each Presbytery is a geographic area, and all the congregations within its boundaries belong to it.
- For the last 14 years or so, SA has had just the one Presbytery, with "Mission Networks" operating on a basis of *shared interest* rather than geography.
- Some of the Networks had a clearly-defined position around a traditional biblical understanding and/or traditional values of human sexuality.
- Seacliff joined the COMN (Community Outreach Mission Network): congregations in this Network shared a primary focus on a theology of care and service rather than on a theology of specified belief statement.
- The national Assembly meeting last July resolved to make provision for the UCA to recognise and conduct samegender marriage. Following that, there were moves interstate for *non-geographic Presbyteries* to be established, so that people distressed or displeased by the Assembly decision could remain within the broader Uniting Church but stand aside from endorsing and being part of the church's new position re marriage.

Normally this is not possible, but an acceptable form of words has been found to make it possible in SA. Back in January this year, the task group managing the process asked us for a *preliminary indication* (not binding) of whether we were likely to join the new non-geographic Presbytery. Given that we are presently part of COMN, Church Council resolved that we were unlikely to find the proposed new Presbytery a good fit for us, and would elect to become part of the area-based Presbytery within which we are located.

This was announced to our people the following Sunday, and there has not been any comment or response since then.

The time has now come when we are required to make the *formal* decision. In practice, the question is whether to re-affirm the earlier indication or change to the new Presbytery. For this we are required to conduct a meeting of the congregation.

- The meeting will be held on **Sunday May 19**th, <u>immediately</u> <u>following</u> the conclusion of worship.
- We anticipate that the meeting will be very brief.
- The proposal to be put will be that Seacliff become part of the area-based Presbytery within which we are located.
- Voting will be by written secret ballot.
- If it turns out that there is any need for further information or discussion, the meeting will be adjourned and will *resume at 11.00 am*, after morning tea.

Next week there will be <u>Insert #2</u> giving some information about the underlying philosophies and values of the different Presbyteries.

This is a significant exercise for the wider Uniting Church – we are all encouraged to take up the opportunity to take part.

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
