A few Property matters FYI

At the recent P&F mtg I offered to seek and collect opinions from those interested about several current matters:

1. For the past year or so, we have employed a contractor to cut our **lawns** and his current contract is coming to an end. He has quoted 1.5hrs or \$74 per month for the coming year. Before we renew this arrangement, several alternatives have been suggested:

a. If anyone or a small group would like to do this on a monthly basis it would save our church about \$900 per year, if so please see me asap.

b. Alternatively, if anyone can recommend another lawn mowing contractor and I will get a quote from them, again please see me asap.

2. It has been suggested that we could install a more permanent **projection screen** in the middle hall for use by Takeus2 and other groups. Any comments and suggestions will be most welcome, possibly after Soapbox one Sunday morning.

3. **Railway iron** sections have recently been stolen from the southern side (i.e. near the fence) of the car park. We are considering if/how they can be replaced, again all suggestions will be welcome asap please.
