Greetings from Hebron, Palestine

Dear SUC family.

I want to firstly thank you for your support and encouragement at the service on the 28th July and to thank the many people who I know are including me in their prayers. I spent the first 4 days in Jerusalem, where the whole team of 22 received initial training before travelling to our placements. I am one of 3 Ecumenical Accompaniers in Hebron which is about 40km by road south of Jerusalem but which took about 2 hours to reach using 2 buses.

The work for the first 4 days, before returning to Jerusalem for a final 3 days training and formal handover ceremony, was quite intense with a number of meetings with key organisations, walks through the old city where we were greatly encouraged by the welcome and hospitality of many of the small shopkeepers and some interaction with security forces on a couple of occasions. Church Council – report to Congregation

Church Council met last Tuesday evening – our first meeting with Rev Gary Stuckey as minister in placement, and a chance to reset our thinking towards the future life of our congregation as we start the journey in this new phase of our community life. Some matters were resolved; many were placed on the table for action over the next 6 – 12 months.

We <u>agreed</u> that we write to the members of the JNC, including Revs Ian Dow and Douglas Mohaghan, to thank them for their work in bring Gary's placement into being.

You may remember a survey we conducted earlier this year, in which several people offered to help with leading worship in various ways. We <u>agreed</u> that we need to follow up on that: my apologies that we haven't before now.

You may remember that that survey also canvassed some options for inviting people / groups beyond our congregation to use our facilities for meetings, gatherings, concerts and similar. We need to follow up those suggestions too.

We <u>have begun</u> the process of reviewing how pastoral care is delivered, including whether our people are receiving the care they need and whether we need to be more systematic and/or intentional in our approach. We expect this process will take a few months.

We <u>have begun</u> the work to create a new pamphlet for giving to people when they come here as visitors or for the first time; we envisage that it might also be distributed to local community groups. It will include a listing of all the various small groups that operate under our umbrella. We hope this will be finished soon.

We <u>agreed</u> that we will review the fairly large number of policy documents that help shape our life here; some of these are very serious, eg, the Child Safe framework; others are important in helping us to treat each other thoughtfully, some of the Privacy matters. All these will be reviewed over the next 6 - 12 months.

The floor in the Wheatland House kitchen and toilet were covered with new lino recently. We are grateful to Von and the P&F Committee for arranging to have this work done, and <u>agreed</u> to write to them to convey our thanks. The finished result looks very good – light and easy on the eye – as well as being quality work.

Over the course of this year, with the assistance of Rev Ian Dow from time to time, we have thought about how we might think of our mission as a congregation. We also recognise that our congregation Mission Statement, for example, was prepared in 2009!! So we will review all these papers over the next 6 – 12 months too, to see which ones offer us helpful ideas about how to frame and think of our mission as the people of God here.

One item you may be more interested in than others – we <u>agreed</u> to proceed to install heating-and-cooling air conditioning in the church worship space and in all the office rooms of Wheatland House. Last Sunday reminded us how cold a winter morning can be; I'm sure it won't be long before we are reminded how hot the days can be too!

If you would like further clarification about any of these items, by all means speak to me or another member of Church Council – our names are on the notice board near the servery in the meeting room (middle hall).
