Today is the first Sunday in Advent – a time of waiting for hope to be fulfilled as we prepare for Christmas. If you look at most litanies for Advent candle ceremonies, it might strike you that they are very 'Northern Hemisphere'. The symbol of light coming into darkness is very appropriate for people heading into midwinter but in southern Australia, it might be good for a change to think of Advent in terms of what we most long for and hope for at this time of year "down under" – water!

From a cool drink to a drenching summer storm, to protection from bushfires when much of our state is tinder-dry, water symbolises what we most need and hope for as we move into summer. Among the **correspondence** to Church Council last Tuesday were 3 letters from organisations seeking financial support. While Council does not use congregation funds to make contributions direct to any organisation, we are happy to endorse these three as worthy of consideration for your personal support:

**Second Chances** – <u>Christmas Angels</u> programme: Second Chances supports prisoners on their release from prison, and their families while they are inside. The <u>Christmas Angels</u> programme provides Christmas presents for the prisoners to give to their children.

**UnitingWorld –** Everything in Common: UnitingWorld is the international service and justice arm of the Uniting Church: this programme provides gifts to fight poverty and build hope in some of the poorest places in our world.

*The Bible Society* has a particular programme running at the moment to provide Bibles for Syria.
