#### Discipleship

As advertised in the weekly newsletter a couple of weeks ago, we will run a set of Advent Studies – a set of 3 – in the first 3 weeks of December. Everyone is most warmly invited to attend; we look forward to a time of rich learning and growth in faith.

#### Mission

Thank you to all the people who purchased a copy of Gary's CD recently, and to those who contributed to the We Dream Mission Project in the process. \$80 was contributed to that fund.

We have ordered this year's Christmas letterbox cards. Christmas is one of the times when people are a little more open than usual to hearing something of the Christian message, and Pine Tree provides us with a different context as well, so we look forward to all the cards being distributed.

In a similar vein, a pamphlet is being prepared for distribution to appropriate local service groups and businesses: it will have a listing of all the groups and activities we run at Seacliff.

#### **Our church community**

Occasionally (and thankfully only occasionally) somebody experiences a <u>medical emergency</u> while attending a church event on our premises. To help us obtain medical help more quickly, we are setting up a Next-of-Kin register, with a form that will contain contact information for next of kin, and permission to call an ambulance if necessary. **Participation in this scheme will be entirely voluntary**, but if you think it could be helpful for you, please collect a form (they'll be available soon) and complete it. The information will be kept safe.

Another part of our community life is to keep in touch with happenings in the wider church community; we have arranged to obtain 30 copies of the SA <u>UCA calendar</u> for 2020, with its stories about what churches are doing, and the weekly list of scripture

readings. The cost to us as a congregation is \$3 each; you are most welcome to take one when they become available: if you would like to make a gold-coin donation towards the cost, that would be gratefully received.

Just to let you know also that we are exploring the possibilities of a <u>church camp</u> next year. Early days yet – at the time of writing, the plan is for an insert in this week's newsletter. If you think you could be at all interested in participating, *watch this space!*

A reminder about our **AGM** on **Sunday Nov 17**<sup>th</sup>, from 11.00 am. We will receive annual reports and elect people to service positions for 2020, so it won't be a short meeting. But we look forward to hearing exciting and inspiring reports about activities and developments here that will inspire us further as we move into the next year.

An item late on the agenda will be a proposal for the date of an ordinary meeting next year, at which we will, among other things, conduct the election for membership of Church Council, and select our mission project(s) for 2020.

And a really, really early notice: I'm currently working through the large number of old files that need to be sent to archive storage (or the alternative "storage"!!). one of the things it's reminding me about is that we have centenary anniversaries coming up: the Methodist church in 1921 and the Presbyterian in 1922. These will be great occasions to reflect on our heritage, and to think how that heritage can enable us better to be the people of God in this area.
