'That the Synod incorporate into its redrafting of the Strategic Plan consideration of our responsibility for Creation Care through theological reflection, education and action'.

This will be presented to the forthcoming Synod of SA which is meeting this week and we will no doubt hear more about this matter in due course. It has been on the UCA agenda for many years, in fact I understand it was mentioned in the basis of union of the UCA over 40 years ago.
