

Easter this year - a note from the Chairperson

The situation for us at Seacliff

It's true that this is a painful event for us. At a personal level, the absence of personal contact, the ability to shake hands and hug, even to see each other, is quite trying.

At a financial level, as a congregation we are going to take a hit – about 1/6 of our annual income, some \$20 000, is the treasurer's calculation.

But for us it's not a crisis. For some congregations it is, but we are not in that place. It is painful for us, and yet it may still be that we will find ourselves in the position where we are able to offer assistance or care in one form or another for another congregation.

The reason we are better placed than some is the high proportion of our people who contribute financially via eGive and direct debit. If you are not part of that programme, because you prefer to make your contribution on Sunday mornings, we ask you for the time being to consider contributing to Seacliff Church by making electronic transfer payments to the church account: **BSB**. **015220**; **Account no. 603002697**. So that we can know who has made contributions, please put your name or envelope number in the ID space.

So I pray God's blessings on us all at this time. Please take advantage of the resources that are made available for you: the print notes, the video, and the other resources available to those of us who have the technology.
