Paying the Imperial Tax to Caesar

Mt.22: 15 - 22

¹⁵ Then the Pharisees went out and laid plans to trap him in his words. ¹⁶ They sent their disciples to him along with the Herodians. "Teacher," they said, "we know that you are a man of integrity and that you teach the way of God in accordance with the truth. You aren't swayed by others, because you pay no attention to who they are. ¹⁷ Tell us then, what is your opinion? Is it right to pay the imperial tax^[a] to Caesar or not?"¹⁸ But Jesus, knowing their evil intent, said, "You hypocrites, why are you trying to trap me? ¹⁹ Show me the coin used for paying the tax." They brought him a denarius, ²⁰ and he asked them, "Whose image is this? And whose inscription?"²¹ "Caesar's," they replied. Then he said to them, "So give back to Caesar what is Caesar's, and to God what is God's."²² When they heard this, they were amazed. So they left him and went away.

Notes from the Treasurer

• **Takeus2** held its final meeting on Oct 11th after 10 years and those gathered agreed that the balance of the cash-in-hand (\$205) be donated to support Tarcisius in Bangladesh. My thanks to Dennis for handling the cash of this Group in recent years.

• Bearing in mind that the balance of the Bangladesh Mission Account on 30/9 was \$330 and now (i.e. with Takeus2 donation) at least \$535 Council accepted my recommendation that we pay a further **\$720** (i.e. 4 months @ \$180) to support them until end of Jan at which time the situation will be reviewed.

I am confident our special Mission donations in Oct, Nov and Dec will cover this \$185 gap. We are also making arrangements to send them the box of educational materials that I intended to deliver earlier this year. Tarcisius has provided a Report of their finances and activities which will be included in the Annual Reports.

• I have just been informed that Uniting Church Congregations are no longer eligible for a continuation of the Federal **Jobkeeper** payments. FYI, we have received a total of \$19,500 which has certainly kept us 'afloat' over the past few months. More details will be in my annual Financial Report to the Congregation in due course.

• The Church has recently purchased a **Card Reader** that can be paired with a mobile phone and will be used at the forthcoming Craft Fair for deposits and also possibly at other events such as the Centenary in May next year. Any enquiries about other possible uses to Heather or myself please. Blessings, David (I'll be back next week!)
