30 ²⁴ "Then the man who had received one bag of gold came. 'Master,' he said, 'I knew that you are a hard man, harvesting where you have not sown and gathering where you have not scattered seed. ²⁵ So I was afraid and went out and hid your gold in the ground. The flag problem

My answer to the flag problem posed by Max last week is as follows:

Assumptions

- The flag is twice as wide as it is high
- The circle needs to be the same area as black and red
- Let 'x' be the height of the flag
- Let 'y' be the radius of the circle (and 2y the diameter)

Then

 $\pi y^2 = 2x^2/3$ and $\pi y^2 = 0.67x^2$

Therefore, taking square roots:

 $\sqrt{\pi}$ y = $\sqrt{0.67}$ x and y = 0.82/1.8 x and y = 0.46 x

This means that the circle is 0.92 of the height and 0.46 of the width of the flag. QED
