- 2. Regarding the proposed support of "Circle of Friends 111".

 Although not yet formally ratified by the congregation I have had several queries from members so: (with Max's approval)
 - a. I have placed some notices on the Notice board for your information, please feel to take one /replace it when you have read it, as you wish.

- 3. Following the consensus decision to proceed with the **Pew Cushions** as part of our Centenary celebrations, donations are now being received. Let's call it the "Cash for Cushions" Appeal and I will keep you up-to-date with a monthly report!
