EASTER DAY



The Empty Tomb Jn 20: 1-9

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. ² So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we don't know where they have put him!"

³ So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. ⁴ Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. ⁵ He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there but did not go in. ⁶ Then Simon Peter came along behind him and went straight into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there, ⁷ as well as the cloth that had been wrapped around Jesus' head. The cloth was still lying in its place, separate from the linen. ⁸ Finally the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and believed. ⁹ (They still did not understand from Scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead.)

COVID UPDATE

We recently reported that the South Australian Government updated its COVID-19 restrictions which come into effect today, 31st March 2021 as follows:

- 1. The density requirement will move from 1 person per 2 square metres to 3 people per 4 square metres (equivalent to 75%)
- 2. The capacity for cinemas, live theatres, performance venues and places of worship **with fixed seating** will increase from 75% to 100% provided attendees are wearing a mask.

Density requirements for churches:

- 1. Where worshippers are in fixed seating the requirement that worshippers wear masks when more than 75% of the seats are occupied
- 2. Where worshippers are not in fixed seating the requirement that worshippers wear masks if the total number of persons present at the place exceeds 3 persons per 4 square metres.

Churches must take reasonable steps to maintain 1.5m physical distancing. Contact tracing is required.
Churches must continue to have a COVID Marshal.
COVID Safe Plans will be updated and sent to churches automatically. Felicity Amery - General Secretary - UCA Synod.
