

DISCOVERING MEDITATION

Meditation is an ancient art that has been, and still is, practised by people from many different religious and even non-religious backgrounds. It is an ancient tradition which brings a timeless wisdom to our contemporary situation.

Perhaps you have thought you might like to try meditation but haven't known where to begin.

Over three weeks I will be offering an introduction which will give you the opportunity to learn about, practise and experience the art of meditation. During these three weeks you will :-

- ..discover how meditation enhances our wellbeing; body, mind and spirit
- ..learn different ways of meditating and how to discover a way that helps you.
- ..explore how to begin meditating and nurture your practise of meditation
- ..discover ways to overcome obstacles in our meditating, eg. how to deal with distractions.

The sessions are largely practical, giving you the opportunity to experience, reflect on, and grow in your practise of meditation.
