Last week's AGM – a follow-up and a big Thank You

My grateful thanks to the people who were able to be present for the AGM last Sunday. It was a longish meeting, but a lot was accomplished.

News / a reminder, as appropriate, re the meeting:

Elections

A huge Thank You to all the people who agreed to be elected to the various service roles. We look forward with confidence to the congregation growing as a community of the people of God. We do need to appoint a secretarial assistant though.

We agreed to a draft <u>Budget</u>, which set out our expenditure priorities for 2022; the updated formal document will come to the next part of the AGM for assent.

Mission Projects

This item took up most of our time – and I was pleased that we gave this amount of time to working out the best way to support people beyond our own gathered community.

We agreed as a congregation to continue to support *Circle of Friends*.

Re *Oodnadatta UAICC Faith Community*: the Oodnadatta building fund stands at just over \$40 000 (our contributions by the end of this year will be \$3842); Congress is allocating \$300 000 from its reserves, and detailed planning is well under way. Because of the extra expense of remote-area building, the plan is to use refurbished shipping containers: they form the structural elements, but can also be partly fitted out in Adelaide and transported to the site by truck, with only the final installation needing to be done on site. This is a considerable cost saving. Congress was quite excited to learn that Seacliff people are interested to find out how things are going, and very grateful for our support. They want us to know also that Pastor Julia Lennon is doing a wonderful job with the Congress Community there.

Concerning Tarcisius and the We Dream project:

- We committed ourselves to continuing support for 2022, and will make a decision for 2023 early next year;
- A payment of \$1080 is due to be made in mid-February next year – since last week, some further amounts have been given by Seacliff people, and the balance to be found now stands at \$383. If you are thinking to support We Dream for 2022, it will be very helpful if you can make at least a part of that contribution by the end of January, so that this payment can go ahead.

Continuing support for projects

We still need to find a practical way to maintain ongoing support of our projects: your thoughts and ideas about how we might achieve this will be most welcome. We have the present set of envelopes; we have a number of stalls that are run from time to time, but we may not presume on the decisions of any of the people who run them – our procedure here is that it's the people who run the stalls who have the primary call on who the beneficiaries of their activities will be.

And we were presented with this challenge: to continue our financial support for ourselves and our congregation at its present level, and at the same time increase our support for the Mission Projects to at least that same level. We did not discuss the suggestion further – so it remains before us.

<u>Membership of Synod</u> (our state-level gathering)

A reminder that we are able to nominate up to two *confirmed members* to a pool of people from whom the Presbytery will select its reps. If you would like to have the opportunity to be involved in the wider church, please let Rosemary know.

The second part of the AGM – receiving reports – will be conducted on **Feb 20**th, **2022**, starting at 11.00 am approx.
