²³ Before the coming of this faith, we were held in custody under the law, locked up until the faith that was to come would be revealed. ²⁴ So the law was our guardian until Christ came that we might be justified by faith.²⁵ Now that this faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian.

²⁶ So in Christ Jesus, you are all children of God through faith, ²⁷ for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ. ²⁸ There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus.

²⁹ If you belong to Christ, then you are Abraham's seed, and heirs according to the promise.

Steps on the Spiritual Journey

Throughout the human journey, we mark various steps along the way. Birthdays mark our journey through time. Anniversaries recall significant life events. Our transitions from one phase of life to another, such as in retirement, are celebrated.

The journey of faith is also marked and celebrated in various ways. In baptism, we are brought into the community of faith, and it expresses the desire of those, usually parents, who care for us that we embrace this faith tradition and community. If we were not baptised as children, baptism acknowledges our own embracing of faith and commitment to the faith community.

Many of us were baptised as children and at some point, acknowledged that faith as our own through confirmation. Still others, having been both baptised and confirmed, having had a significant experience of renewing or deepening faith, have publicly expressed that in a reaffirmation of baptism.

Which is all a long introduction to say that if, in your spiritual journey, you have experienced the awakening or deepening of faith and would like to explore that further I would be very happy to do this with you. Or you may feel more comfortable doing this with another member of the congregation.

This does not necessarily mean that a public profession of that faith step has to happen; it may simply mean that we have the opportunity to explore this together. Often these celebrations (i.e. baptism and confirmation) are associated with children of teenagers. But deepening steps in the faith journey can happen and be celebrated at any age.

If you would like to talk further about your own faith journey and/or the possibility of publicly expressing that in some way, please feel free to talk with me or someone else about it.
