SEACLIFF SPIRITUALITY- COMING PROGRAMMES Quiet Day NB: Change of reflection topic.

I have had to make a change to the topic on which we will reflect on this Quiet Day. Rather than focus on Henri Nouwen's "The Return of the Prodigal", the focus will be "Journey to Freedom". You will be invited to reflect on the Exodus, not only as an event in Israel's past but as a present reality for us all. The Exodus invites us to journey from whatever enslaves or binds us to freedom. A Quiet half-day actually will be held on **Tuesday 22**nd **November** from 9:30am-12:30pm (stay for a BYO lunch if you would like to.)

Advent Reflection

Each Advent we, at Seacliff, have offered a three-week reflection exploring the events we have celebrated many times, Advent, and Christmas. In the invariable busyness of the season, we can perhaps feel a bit disconnected from the story of Jesus' birth and its meaning for us in the 21st Century.

The theme for this year will be, "The Birth of Jesus- a Fresh Look". We know the Christmas story well, perhaps too well, from pageants, carols and perhaps movies. But what if there is more to the story? These three sessions will revisit the Christmas stories and hopefully bring new life to this timeless story of wonder- the birth of Jesus.

Sessions will be held on Tuesday 29/11, 6/12 and 13/12 at 10:30am and Thursday 1, 8 and 15/12 at 2:00pm.
