1 Cor 3: 1 - 9

3 Brothers and sisters, I could not address you as people who live by the Spirit but as people who are still worldly—mere infants in Christ. ² I gave you milk, not solid food, for you were not yet ready for it. Indeed, you are still not ready. ³ You are still worldly. For since there is jealousy and quarrelling among you, are you not worldly? Are you not acting like mere humans? ⁴ For when one says, "I follow Paul," and another, "I follow Apollos," are you not mere human beings?

⁵ What, after all, is Apollos? And what is Paul? Only servants, through whom you came to believe—as the Lord has assigned to each his task. ⁶ I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow. ⁷ So neither the one who plants nor the one who waters is anything, but only God, who makes things grow. ⁸ The one who plants and the one who waters have one purpose, and they will each be rewarded according to their own labour. ⁹ For we are co-workers in God's service; you are God's field, God's building.

Quiet Day

There will be four Quiet Days (or Quiet half days really) in 2023. The first will be on **Tuesday February 21**st commencing at **9:30am** and concluding at 12:30pm. For those who wish to, you can stay and share fellowship over a BYO lunch with other retreatants.

The theme for this year will be "*The Seasons of Life*". Every year we observe the cycle of the seasons, watching life germinate, sprout, blossom and grow, and then retreat into the waiting time before the cycle begins again. As the earth is transformed, so too can our lives be.

The first session, as it will nearly be Autumn, will focus on that season, the season of surrender and shedding. What can we learn about how to move forward in our lives from Autumn?
