⁶ Abraham took the wood for the burnt offering and placed it on his son Isaac, and he himself carried the fire and the knife. As the two of them went on together, ⁷ Isaac spoke up and said to his father Abraham, "Father?" "Yes, my son?" Abraham replied. "The fire and wood are here," Isaac said, "but where is the lamb for the burnt offering?" ⁸ Abraham answered, "God himself will provide the lamb for the burnt offering, my son."

And the two of them went on together. ⁹ When they reached the place God had told him about, Abraham built an altar there and arranged the wood on it. He bound his son Isaac and laid him on the altar, on top of the wood. ¹⁰ Then he reached out his hand and took the knife to slay his son. ¹¹ But the angel of the Lord called out to him from heaven, "Abraham! Abraham!" "Here I am," he replied. ¹² "Do not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son." ¹³ Abraham looked up and there in a thicket he saw a ram caught by its horns. He went over and took the ram and sacrificed it as a burnt offering instead of his son. ¹⁴ So Abraham called that place The Lord Will Provide.

By chance I met the lovely lady who runs their community food program (which includes a free community meal once a week) and the pastoral care worker who looks after the kids at Brighton Primary next door. My small contribution was welcomed with a blessing - there is great need at the moment, as they are feeding hundreds of people every week. We live in a relatively comfortably off area, so it is easy to think that there is no need - but nearly every time I make a drop off the cupboard is almost like Mother Hubbard's, not much left. My heart went out to the young man sat on the ground in the car park, eating some of the buns that were part of what was on offer today, with a loaf of bread in his lap.

We used to have a collection box in the middle hall for pantry staples - if I remember correctly the contributions were delivered to the Church of Christ on Sturt Road. I'm going to re-instate a box and am happy to be the delivery person. We could support both Grocer with a Heart and St Judes.

MARION CITY LIONS

On behalf of the Marion City Lions I would like to thank those who attended and/or assisted with our cabaret in May. More than \$2400 was raised with all proceeds being distributed between Gwen's Pantry, Marion Life, St Andrew's By the Sea, Picket Fence, Hutt Street Centre and Baptist Care Winter Blanket Appeal. In the last 12 months, we have raised more than \$15,000 to help Adelaide's hungry and homeless people. We have also donated funds to The Lions Hearing Dogs, The Children's Cancer Foundation and Marion Food Bank. We have provided 14 packs of kitchen and laundry products to Bramwell House for abused women and children. Our knitting group has donated 365 knitted beanies, rugs, shawls and toys to vulnerable women and children and we have donated nearly 1400 track suits to The Flinders Medical Centre Emergency Department. The Club has recycled 710 pairs of prescription glasses, sunglasses and hearing aids and the Sewing Group has made and distributed 600 sensory mats for those in aged care facilities.

We are always seeking new members to assist with barbecues at Bunnings, The Blackwood Lions Bargain Centre, knitting, sewing and helping in general. We meet the third Wednesday of the month at Club Marion at 11.30am. If you are unable to become a member, you can help out by donating glasses and hearing aids, stamps and stamp collections, bottles and cans and buying our cakes and puddings.

Hi Seacliff Uniting Church!

My name is Bethany Seyfang. I am a Youth Worker at Seaview High School (and part of our Wellbeing Team). We provide emergency food for students and we are quickly running out of supplies. We usually source our food from Foodbank, but unfortunately in these really tough times, Foodbank's supply is also limited in foods that we can provide. I'm here to ask if you might be willing to put a call out to your congregation to see if anyone is able to add something to their shop for us so that we can continue to feed our food-poor students.

Last week alone we fed over 30 students. It might not sound like many, but these students represent 30 families in our school, and in your local community - and they are just the students who felt able to approach us! Food shame is really prevalent among young people, and in these tough times our families are struggling even more - as we all are. Helping to feed our students helps them to concentrate, engage in school, refuels them throughout the day, and lightens the worry and stress on them and their families.

We're looking for individually wrapped or packet foods you might put in a lunch box - like chips/shapes/popcorn/crackers, biscuits, muesli bars, even bread rolls and fruit - or anything else you might think is suitable! If even just 10 people provide one item, we would have another week worth of food to be able to provide our students.

I'm happy to get in contact to organise a pick-up time, or explain how people can drop food off to us. We're hoping to have a supply of food at the ready in the beginning of next term, so about 3 weeks away, but can pick up or accept donations at any time.
