#### The Day of the Lord

Now when the Son of Man comes in his majesty ... he will sit on his majestic throne. All the nations will be gathered before him. He will separate them from each other, just as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right side and the goats on his left.



Then the king will say to those on his right, "Come, you who will receive good things from my Father. Inherit the kingdom that was prepared for you before the world began. I was hungry and you gave me food to eat. I was thirsty and you gave me a drink. I was a stranger and you welcomed me. I was naked and you gave me clothes to wear. I was sick and you took care of me. I was in prison and you visited me. Then those who are righteous will say to him, "Lord, when did we (do all this for you)?

Then the king will reply, "I assure you that when you have done it for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you have done it for me."

Then he will say to those on his left, "Get away from me, you who will receive terrible things. (I was hungry and thirsty and in deep need and you did nothing for me. ... When you neglected or refused to help anybody, even of the least importance, you neglected and refused me. The righteous will go into eternal life, but you ..."
