


But this event wouldn't have happened without the work done behind the scenes by many people.

- 1. I am pleased to report that the total proceeds from the **Spring Fair** were \$2,422 (*including over \$600 on the Card Reader*). A very special thank you to Heather, Maureen and their helpers. Church Council will announce in due course exactly how this money will be allocated
- 2. As announced last week, our Church is willing and able to accept and forward donations to the *National Council of Churches 'Emergency: GAZA Appeal'* at least for a few weeks until such time as envelopes become available for individual use.

Please place any donations in a labelled envelope (there will be some at the back entry door) and then into the Offering Bowl.

Alternatively, you can pay online using our Bank details which we do not want to be made public and are available from me. I can provide a receipt for tax purposes if you wish, if so please see me.

3. The **new air-conditioning units** in both Halls have been installed and are operational, and I can tell you that Geoff Lister was very pleased to hear this. The units have conventional controls and the Manuals are kept in a designated pigeonhole.
