Jesus Has Risen Mark 16: 1-8

16 When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go to anoint Jesus' body. ² Very early on the first day of the week, just after sunrise, they were on their way to the tomb ³ and they asked each other, "Who will roll the stone away from the entrance of the tomb?" ⁴ But when they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had been rolled away. ⁵ As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed.

⁶ "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. ⁷ But go, tell his disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him, just as he told you.'" ⁸ Trembling and bewildered, the women went out and fled **from** the tomb. They said nothing to anyone, because they were afraid.

Hope you're enjoying this lovely weather and our (lighthearted) book.


Our meeting next **Wednesday 3rd March** will be at my place, beginning as usual at **1.30.pm**.

Notes from the Treasurer (and Property assistant)

- 1. Many thanks to Geoff Lister for getting the quotes and making the arrangements and those volunteers who helped to lift the old **carpet** from the Middle Hall and clean the area and to James who fixed a loose edge beneath the doorway. Andrew and Ruth are planning to use some of the old carpet as matting to supress weeds in the Community Garden. The total cost of the project was \$5146, which together with the 'new' chairs and recent Air Con now makes it a very comfortable Room for use by both us and our Tenants.
- 2. Our next project is to have the **trees removed** at the front of the Church on Wednesday April 17th. To prepare for this there will be a 'Paver Gang' on Tuesday April 16th from 8am to lift, clean, stack and store about 1200 paving bricks for which we will need some tools and the use of a '6x4' trailer for a few days. It will be dirty, manual work (i.e. *no place for crook backs please*) but we will arrange morning tea and if all goes well you should be home for lunch! If you are able to help with this project please see me soon and put the date in your diary.
- We will have a planning meeting after Soapbox on Sunday April 14th. Obviously, there will need to be another Gang to reinstate some of the bricks and make a garden bed, if interested 'pencil in' at least Tuesday 23rd for this please.
- 3. As has been said, this will be our last June Long Weekend **Booksale** (*after 20 years*) and in due course we will need helpers on Friday June 14th to transport the books from the shed and put them out on the tables. We will then need to dispose of most (if not all) of them (at least 1 tonne) and we need some information about Organisations that might like to come with their truck and take them away, probably on that Monday 10th if possible, or otherwise on Tuesday 11th to avoid double-handling. Please make some enquires and tell me if you have any 'leads' which I will then follow up.
