²⁵ When they found him on the other side of the lake, they asked him, "Rabbi, when did you get here?" ²⁶ Jesus answered, "Very truly I tell you, you are looking for me, not because you saw the signs I performed but because you ate the loaves and had your fill. ²⁷ Do not work for food that spoils, but for food that endures to eternal life, which the Son of Man will give you. For on him God the Father has placed his seal of approval." ²⁸ Then they asked him, "What must we do to do the works God requires?"

²⁹ Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has sent." ³⁰ So they asked him, "What sign then will you give that we may see it and believe you? What will you do? ³¹ Our ancestors ate the manna in the wilderness; as it is written: 'He gave them bread from heaven to eat." ³² Jesus said to them, "Very truly I tell you, it is not Moses who has given you the bread from heaven, but it is my Father who gives you the true bread from heaven. ³³ For the bread of God is the bread that comes down from heaven and gives life to the world."³⁴ "Sir," they said, "always give us this bread."³⁵ Then Jesus declared, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never go hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.

Care and Ministry at Seacliff UC

With the retirement of Rev Gary at the end of July, your Church Council has put in place a number of arrangements for the continuing life of this congregation over the next little while.

We are not expecting that there will be a minister in placement before December at the earliest; we have also resolved that we will not seek to have Supply Ministry in place until October – we believe we are able to sustain our life in this congregation at least for that amount of time. The process of arranging Supply Ministry has begun.

The preaching plan has been prepared for the next 3 months. Please note that the <u>celebration of Holy Communion</u> for those 3 months will be a week earlier than usual; our custom is the 1st Sunday of each month: the next 3 will be on the last Sunday of July, August September. (Things just happened to work out that way!!)

Church Council has put in place arrangements for:

<u>Pastoral Care</u>: if there is a need for particular Pastoral care, including emergencies, please contact Annette Craven; Rev Jim Win will also be available to assist.

<u>Worship</u>: general Sunday arrangements will be under Max's oversight; Maureen will continue the Meditation programme. Oversight will be provided by CC for Small Groups and our discipleship (study/reflection sessions) programme.

Please offer your support in person and in prayer for the people undertaking these various roles on our behalf. It's not a common experience for us – the last time was 5½ years ago. But as a result of Gary's support and encouragement over his 5 years with us, we find ourselves in a good place to be able to undertake this task.
